During the past 20 years Prof Brockington has carried out research on conservation, environmentalism and what is now called 'the Green Economy.' Currently he is exploring trends in agricultural change, livelihoods and prosperity through two projects. One is on long term livelihood change in Tanzania and another on irrigation in Africa. Amongst many other related interests, an offshoot of his research into capitalism and conservation lead to study of the work of celebrity in environmental affairs.

Prof. Brockington's books include: <u>Fortress Conservation</u> (2002), <u>Nature Unbound</u> (With Rosaleen Duffy and Jim Igoe, 2008), <u>Celebrity and the Environment</u> (2009) and <u>Celebrity Advocacy and International Development</u> (2014). He is currently the Director of the Sheffield Institute for International Development (SIID).
